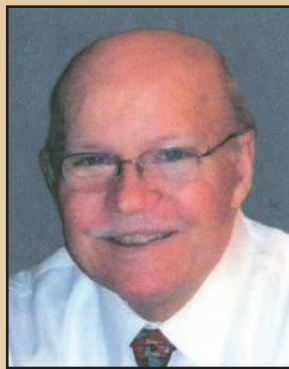

Dear Friends and Families,

We ended the 2009 – 2010 school year with a beautiful graduation celebration on May 27th at The Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. What a glorious event! If you have never participated in the SJA graduation you have missed one of the most beautiful, dignified ceremonies ever. As we bid farewell to our graduates, we wish them the best in their exciting futures.

Saying goodbye is always difficult but we have so many exciting things to look forward to next school year. Many changes are in place. Some of you may know about these changes but others may not. Based on two reports completed in January, 2010, the SJA Board of Directors decided to take a bold step in restructuring the school. First, I was named Head of School in February, 2010. Although I have always been very involved in the day to day operations of the school, under the new model I will become more involved. This will result in one voice supporting the mission and vision. An Academic Dean, directly responsible for curriculum and instruction, will work closely with me. A dean of students will also be part of the administrative team with a focus on addressing discipline, attendance, and positive school culture. New faculty will join several returning faculty in creating "A New Day at SJA". Many changes will be incorporated including but not limited to:

- + increased focus on 21st century academics
- + research based best practice
- + improved student achievement
- + data driven decision making
- + focus on core academics
- + increased accountability for students, staff, and administration
- + implementation of restorative justice
- + improved use of advisory
- + a new schedule promoting increased time for academics
- + technology integrated in all studies
- + increased exposure to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math)
- + greater attention to celebrations of various diverse cultures
- + project based learning

The Board of Directors will also be changing. Jerry Vite will be ending his tenure as Chair. Father Doug Leonhardt, former President of Marquette University High School, will be the new Chair of the Board. We are thankful to Jerry for his guidance and leadership. We welcome Fr. Leonhardt as well as several new Board Members who will be introduced in our fall newsletter. The school's Leadership Team will be: Cynthia Marino, Head of School; Sr. Elizabeth Weber, Provincial Team, Sisters of Charity; Maria Schram, Academic Dean; Jamilah Underwood, Dean of Students; Elizabeth Lingen, Director of Admissions; and Nandini Sinha, Chief Development Officer.

These are but a few of the changes you will see when you walk through our doors. There are, however, some things that will NOT change. We remain steadfast in our commitment to our mission and vision as stated below:

In the 2009/10 school year, 11 Saint Joan Antida high school students, under the guidance of teachers Linda Krause and Cindy McLinn, were invited to participate in the SMART (Students Modeling a Research Topic) Team through MSOE's Center for Biomolecular Modeling. The volunteer mentor this year was Dr. Mary Holtz from the Medical College of Wisconsin. The topic chosen was Vascular Endothelial Growth Factor Type-B, known as VEGF-B which helps blood vessels to function correctly. The final presentation took place at MCW.

Senior Design Project for Engineering

Do you ever find yourself wasting money on replacing plastic food storage containers because you've lost the lids or do you wake up sore on Monday morning after spending the weekend raking and bagging leaves? These problems were addressed by the first two SJA teams taking the Engineering Design and Development (EDD) class.

This capstone Project Lead the Way class enabled the students to select and research a real-life problem and then design and prototype the solution. During the course of the year, the students were mentored by volunteers from Johnson Controls. The four seniors completing the capstone were Michelle Gonzalez and Nada Ismail, who designed a stay-on lid collapsible food storage container and Meghan

Krause and Sophia Rizzo, who designed the "Reel Rake". They presented their projects at the first annual EDD project exhibition held at SJA on Tuesday, May 25, to nearly fifty attendees who included family members, educators and engineering professionals.

The student projects were judged by local engineering professionals who included Dan Curtis, Terry Hoffmann and Joe Noworatzky from Johnson Controls, Dave Newman from Marquette University, Jay Refling from Miller-Coors and Sarah Larson and Elicia Turnbull (SJA '03) from Rockwell Automation. The four students were later recognized at Honors Day by receiving the Engineering Department Excellence Awards.

Mix 12 to 15 Freshwomen and two teachers on a Saturday morning between 9:00 and noon and what do you have? Saturday School in Sancey Hall! Three of the best hours in the week where teachers and students work together, make academic progress, build friendships, and laugh at the silliest things. For SJA students to succeed and be leaders in the global society the Freshwomen teachers saw a need to help the girls succeed. Our world is changing rapidly and we need to help prepare the girls for jobs that have not yet been invented.

To fulfill this vision the teachers of the Freshwomen Academy take an idea that already existed at SJA on a very limited basis, that of Saturday School, and expanded it to operate on a regularly scheduled basis. Admissions Office Update

SJA is undergoing some exciting changes for the coming school year!

One of these changes – transportation services – will have a dramatic impact on the ability of some young women to choose SJA. We often speak with families who are interested in SJA, but our lack of available bus service has made it difficult for them to get to school each day. Now that we will be offering transportation to both the north and south side neighborhoods, families will find it much easier to consider an all-girls education for their daughters.

This spring, we have been receiving a number of phone calls from families who have believed that they were out of time to be eligible for Choice vouchers or financial aid at a private high school. These families felt that a Catholic education was out of reach for their daughters. SJA has always had a passionately strong commitment to providing Catholic education for young women at an affordable cost. We are still able to offer Choice spots and financial aid for fall enrollment, so if you know of a young woman who could benefit from a Catholic high school education, please contact the Admissions Office at 414-274-4709. We would be happy to meet with them individually to discuss options that will meet their financial needs.
